BUS DRIVER TRAINER

DEFINITION

Under general supervision, to provide classroom, behind-the-wheel and continuing training to Bus Drivers and driver trainees; to administer driving performance tests; to maintain official District bus driver training records; to perform the full range of duties of a Bus Driver; and to perform related work as required.

CLASS CHARACTERISTICS

Positions in this class have as an assignment scheduling and conducting the training of new and current bus driving personnel. Bus Driver Trainer also performs the full range of duties of a school bus driver. The Bus Driver Trainer has responsibility to insure that the District's school bus drivers are qualified under law and properly licensed and certified to drive the assigned vehicle.

EXAMPLES OF DUTIES

The tasks listed in this section are representative of duties assigned to positions in this class. This list is not intended to be an exhaustive list of all of the tasks assigned to positions in the class, and it is not expected that all of the tasks listed are necessarily assigned to all positions in the class.

Schedule and conduct driver training for school bus drivers and trainees, which includes classroom and behind-the-wheel training in pertinent provisions of the vehicle and education codes, efficient vehicle operation, first aid, and safety; conduct meetings of drivers to discuss matters related to safety and bus operation; schedule bus driver examinations.

Maintain training records for licensed drivers and trainees in accordance with state continuing education and training regulations; monitor records of each driver to ensure that State and District training and retraining standards are met.

Answer questions from the public; perform a variety of specialized transportation-related administrative support work such as scheduling and conducting bus evacuation training and making presentations to parents and students.

Drive a bus over designated rural, urban and suburban routes in accordance with time schedules, picking up and/or discharging students, stopping traffic as necessary to escort students safely across streets; assist special needs students on and off bus and with restraints; operate wheelchair lift; maintain good order among students on the buses, following strict policies regarding the issuance of citations and disciplining of students; discuss student discipline problems with school administrators and parents; communicate with parents of special education students to discuss special needs and pick-up/drop-off times; transport students, faculty and parents on field trips to special events, meeting departure and arrival times as scheduled.

Use maps to determine best routes to special events.

Operate a two-way radio.

Complete periodic reports on mileage traveled, citations issued, accidents, and number of students transported; maintain route files; complete daily check-out sheet and trip sheets. Perform daily safety inspection of vehicles; fuel vehicles; maintain buses in a clean condition; wash buses, keep records of the operation of assigned vehicles as required by the district.

Provide bus evacuation training to students and teachers.

Administer first aid to students, as needed.

Serve on assigned committees and teams.

Participate in District mandated training and retraining programs.

Perform related work as required.

LICENSE REQUIRED

Possession of a valid and appropriate California Driver's License.

Successful completion of the Driving and First Aid examinations for school bus drivers given by the California Highway Patrol.

Certificate of physical/medical examination.

Possession of a valid unrestricted California School Bus Driver's Certificate.

Acceptance into the California State Department of Education Bus Driver Instructor course must be obtained prior to appointment.

Possession of a valid unrestricted California State Department of Education Bus Driver Instructor Certificate required prior to completion of probationary period.

QUALIFICATIONS

Knowledge of:

Provisions of the California Motor Vehicle Code, the Education Code, and District regulations applicable to the operation of vehicles in the transportation of students and the operation of District school buses and vehicles.

The school district and surrounding area.

Operation of school busses and vehicles.

Basic first aid.

Basic bus maintenance procedures.

Appropriate safety precautions and procedures.

Training requirements for school bus driver licensing.

General principles of training.

Basic mathematics.

English usage, grammar and spelling.

Routine record keeping and report preparation practices.

Ability to:

Speak clearly before groups.

Prepare and present well structured lessons.

Manage group participation effectively.

Develop effective learning materials.

Write in English using proper word usage and grammar.

Make accurate mathematical calculations.

Drive school buses of various sizes safely, observing legal and defensive driving techniques.

Maintain discipline among students riding the bus.

Maintain accurate and complete records.

Pass a physical examination as prescribed by the state.

Train school bus drivers in classroom and behind-the-wheel setting. Administer first aid. Read a map. Understand and carry out oral and written instructions. Establish and maintain effective working relationships with those contacted in the course of work.

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE

Any combination of training, education and experience which demonstrates possession of the knowledge and abilities stated above, and the ability to perform the duties of the position. The typical qualifying entrance background is three years of experience as a school bus driver and completion of a formal classroom and behind-the-wheel training program approved by the California Highway Patrol for the operation of a school bus.

PHYSICAL ABILITIES AND WORKING CONDITIONS OF EMPLOYMENT

PHYSICAL DEMANDS ASSOCIATED TASKS

Vision: (which may be corrected) Read small print See small objects at a distance of 25' Use peripheral vision

Hearing: (which may be corrected) Understand speech over a recording device Hear sounds which warn of impending danger

Analyze sounds of equipment operation Have tolerance to be exposed to noisy conditions

Speech:

Speak with a level of proficiency and volume to be understood over a two-way radio Speak with a level of proficiency and volume to understood in conditions of high noise level be

Upper Body Mobility:

Use hands and fingers to feel, grasp, and manipulate small objects, manipulate fingers, twist and bend hands at wrist and elbow

Extend arms to reach outward and upward and use hands and arms to lift objects

Turn, raise, and lower head; twist and bend at torso

To perform tasks such as to:

Read maps Avoid damage to vehicle and prevent injuries Safely operate a vehicle

To perform tasks such as to:

Communicate on two-way radio Stop for railroad crossings and emergency vehicles Detect mechanical problems with vehicle Transport groups of students to school and events

To perform tasks such as to:

Communicate on two-way radio

Maintain order among students

To perform tasks such as to:

Keep records and use maps; operate school bus; operate child restraints; lift children

Maintain vehicle in clean and orderly condition; lift children; safety inspect bus Check for traffic and obstructions; pick up trash in vehicle

Lower Body Mobility:

Walk on even surfaces Climb stairs/ladders Bend at waist, crawl and stoop

Stand for short periods of 30 minutes

Sit for prolonged periods of 2 hours

Strength:

To lift, push, pull and/or carry objects which weigh as much as 40 pounds on a occasional basis

Smell:

Distinguish strong odors which may warn of equipment malfunction or danger

Environmental Requirements:

Work independently Work around others

Mental Requirement:

Read and write at a level (simple) essential for successful job performance Judgment

Learn quickly and follow written/verbal procedures and standards

Process information quickly and make quick decisions

To perform tasks such as to:

Clean inside and outside of vehicle Enter and exit vehicle Enter and exit vehicle, clean and maintain vehicle; assist special needs student Maintain vehicle in clean and orderly condition; conduct evacuation training Transport students

To perform tasks such as to:

Maintain vehicle in clean and orderly condition; lift small children in and out of seat and on and off school bus

To perform tasks such as to:

Detect overheating, gasoline leak, and mechanical problems

To perform tasks such as to:

Transport students Transport students, faculty, and parents to special events

To perform tasks such as to:

Read maps and complete simple reports; maintain route books Operate a vehicle safely in all types of weather and read conditions; respond to emergencies Maintain scheduled departure and arrival times; follow codes and emergency procedures without immediate access to superior Avoid obstructions and collisions; respond to emerging situations such as child health, vehicle breakdowns, violence at a special event, to protect safety of students
