U.S. News Best Schools' Award Recognition: Fair Oaks Ranch, Golden Oak, Leona Cox, Mint Canyon, Pinetree, and Valley View Community Schools Dr. Kawaguchi and the Board of Trustees recognized Fair Oaks Ranch, Golden Oak, Leona Cox, Mint Canyon, Pinetree, and Valley View Community Schools for receiving the U.S. News Best Schools Award and presented the Principals with a plaque.

In its 2025 rankings, U.S. News evaluated California's 5,605 public elementary schools based on student proficiency in mathematics and reading/language arts from the 2023 California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) results. While there are no national rankings, these schools ranked among the top 40% in the state.

These Community Schools continue to educate their students from all socioeconomic backgrounds with the goal of setting their students up for success, which prepares them for high school, career, university, and beyond.

California Honor Roll Award for 2024: Golden Oak, Leona Cox, Pinetree, and Fair Oaks Ranch Community Schools Dr. Kawaguchi and the Board of Trustees recognized Golden Oak, Leona Cox, Pinetree, and Fair Oaks Ranch Community Schools for achieving the 2024 California Honor Roll Award and presented the Principals with a plaque.

This accolade, granted by Educational Results Partnership (ERP), highlights schools that have demonstrated accelerated student learning in reading, writing, and math while effectively narrowing the achievement gap among disadvantaged populations.

One thousand eight hundred twenty-three schools received the California Honor Roll recognition, representing about 21% of eligible schools statewide. The Honor Roll is the only recognition program that relies solely on objective student achievement data in partnership with state and local business leaders.

The California Honor Roll is presented by the Campaign for Business and Education Excellence in partnership with various educational and business organizations.

California Honor Roll Award for 2024: Sulphur Springs Union School District Dr. Kawaguchi announced that the Sulphur Springs Union School District has received the 2024 California Honor Roll Award, recognizing it for exceptional achievement in closing gaps among higher-poverty and historically disadvantaged student populations.

A total of 168 districts, roughly 22% of eligible districts in California, earned this distinction based on 2024 California Assessment of Student Performance and Progress (CAASPP) student outcome data.

The award is jointly presented by the Campaign for Business and Education Excellence and various business organizations across the state.
